The center houses a museum exhibiting Tucson's streetcar and bus history with photographs, models, memorabilia and artifacts including buses used in Tucson and Arizona.

Space is provided for library and archives related to our transportation history. Shops necessary for historic vehicle restoration have been set up, and behind the building is a preservation yard for railroad cars, trolleys and buses. Ties, rail and overhead electric line parts are being stored for future use on a new historic trolley line along S. 4th Ave. An expanded youth training program, initiated this past summer, is providing training in restoration skills and giving students hands on experience leading towards a career.
